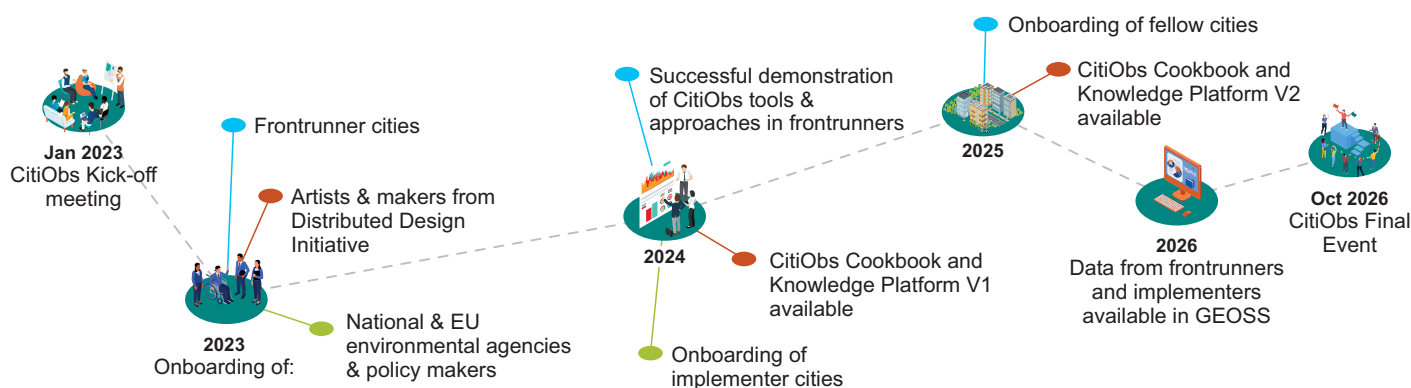

## Description

CitiObs' mission is to support and enhance Citizen Observatories, so that they serve as a vehicle towards sustainable development, resilient cities and inclusivity. CitiObs will collaborate with **Citizen Observatories in 85 cities**, including citizens from all backgrounds, authorities, scientists and other relevant stakeholders, enhancing the co-creation of data, knowledge and citizen-led local actions to improve the urban environment. This project is developed in co-creation with COs in 5 Frontrunner cities, finetuned with 30 Implementer cities and showcased to 50 Fellow cities.

- Achieve more diverse and stable participation** of citizens and communities in the observation, monitoring, and protection of the urban environment via Citizen Observatories

- Greater temporal and spatial availability of citizen observations** as complementary to official observations at local, national and EU institution level for policy and research use
- Large scale demonstration of CitiObs tools and approaches** for enhancing Citizen Observatories
